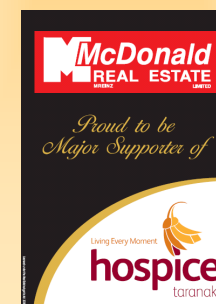

The message which I found most meaningful and relevant was the need to minimise the effect of one’s death on the rest of the family and friends by planning ahead and getting everything in order. Whilst the number attending wasn’t huge, the enthusiasm to debate sensitive issues was refreshing. My thanks to everyone who contributed.

The New Warehouse

The extension to our Borrell Ave warehouse is underway and after some initial challenges with foundations should now be able to proceed at pace. The building funded by our Hospice Taranaki Foundation will allow us to have an appropriately safe and healthy work environment for the many volunteers and staff who manfully toil away processing goods for the HospiceShops.

In a couple of weeks we will also be taking delivery of a replacement delivery truck for our Westown HospiceShop. This is thank to the on-going generous support of Nigel Williams of Budget Rentals in New Plymouth. Thank you Nigel!

From the Chief Executive: *Kevin Nielsen*

Well here we are almost to the shortest day and yet it seems like Christmas was just a few weeks ago. My focus just recently has been preparing the annual budget for financial year 2014/2015. This has been the most difficult budget to put together in the 13 years I have been with Hospice Taranaki.

The combination of increasing patient numbers, increasing costs and restricted government funding makes a very challenging process to try and make ends meet.

Since 2009 when hospice were fortunate to receive targeted additional government funding we have received a combined increase of less than 5% while at the same time patient numbers have increased by 18%.

Sadly this is the reality of the economic times we live in and the reality of the impact of the aging population, not only here in NZ but worldwide. There simply isn’t the amount of money available through taxation to meet the need as we face a doubling of the death rate in NZ over the next 30 years.

So the importance of you, our community, is going to be even more crucial if we are going to continue to provide quality end of life care to the patients and whanau of our province.

We are constantly seeking ways to ensure we are operating as efficiently as we possibly can, with some success. The end result of the budget process is that in the coming financial year we will need to raise \$1.8m from our community. Our HospiceShops continue to be the cornerstone of our fundraising activity. We are hoping to relocate to a larger shop in Stratford early in 2015 which will allow us to increase our sales in that area. The Westown, Waiwhakaiho and Hawera HospiceShops continue to produce excellent results. However it doesn’t get any easier as other organisations get into the secondhand market to raise funds.

So we need you to keep those donations of good saleable items coming in, but please don’t drop off items that are clearly only destined for the tip. We face very significant costs to dispose of unsaleable goods and every dollar spent there is a dollar that cannot go to providing the free palliative care to patients and whanau.

In closing you will have all read the wonderful message we received from the McAlister whanau – it says it all really and it is what makes being involved with hospice so very special. Knowing that the work we collectively do, board, staff and volunteers, really does make a difference for people certainly makes it worthwhile coming to work each day. We cannot continue to do our work without your support in whichever way you are able to offer it. - *Kevin* Thank you all for your support in the past and into the future.


Can you help us to reduce our costs?

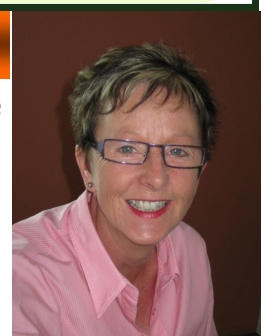


Day Programme : Heather Ternouth
